Summary:

Assist Project Coordinator with NMED 319 Water Quality Grant at Tierra y Montes SWCD. Job will include following but not limited to:

- Bioengineering on stream banks to reduce erosion and siltation
Install structures such as: rock or log weirs, rock or log vanes, baffles, straw wattles, brush bundle fascines, etc.
- Critical area plantings
Critical area planting and mulching on eroded upland & private land
- Diversion structures to divert runoff and provide erosion stabilization
Install structures such as: rock structures, log structures, Zuni bowls, brush bundle fascines, etc.
- Reduce grazing of critical areas
Install fencing at various sites to reduce grazing of critical areas
- Assist with educational outreach
Assist with educational workshops for landowners and public

Job will be out in-the-field; at Sapello site areas (will be allowed to ride with project coordinator to sites). Must be able to walk in rough terrain and work out-doors, must be able to lift heavy objects (about 50 lbs).
